Once inside, you'll find yourself in donut heaven with impossible choices to make, Just a few of the varieties offered include Banana Split, Maple Bacon, Cream-Filled Coconut Long Joes (named after their baker), Strawberry Shortcakes, Almond Fried Cinnamon Pastry, Heath Bar Cake Donut and Caramel Apple Fritter – and so many more.

If you'd like to come back for lunch, the menu includes hamburgers, hotdogs, a homemade soup of the day and a different special every day, such as Taco Tuesdays and Italian Thursdays. The Conies, however, are on special every day. You can even buy Coney sauce by the gallon or the half-gallon.
